

Qualifying Products

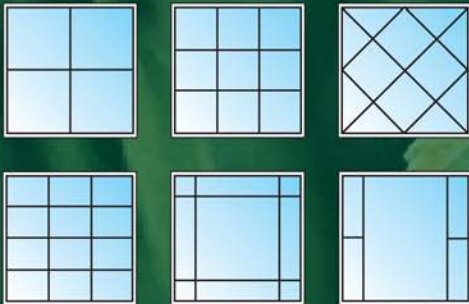
Qualifying products include windows that incorporate:

- A low conductance spacer system.
- A Low E product with a solar control feature to achieve u-value and SHGC requirements.
- Inert gas-fill between the glass panes to achieve u-value requirements.
- Low-conductivity sash and frame materials.

On February 17, 2009, the **American Recovery and Reinvestment Act** of 2009 became law. This law extends and modifies the tax credits for windows, doors, and skylights established in the Energy Policy Act of 2005.

Program Modifications

- Tax credits that were previously effective for 2009 have been extended to 2010.
- The tax credit percentage for windows has been raised from 10% to 30%.
- The maximum dollar value credit has been raised from \$500 to \$1500.
- The \$200 cap for windows has been removed.
- The tax credit applies to the cost of the product only and does not include installation costs. *Be sure to ask for a sales receipt that itemizes the window cost separate from installation.*

Qualification Guidelines

The tax credit for energy efficient windows is available for existing homes only.

Windows must meet requirements of less than or equal to 0.30 u-value and less than or equal to 0.30 SHGC.

U-value is the heat flow rate through a material. U-value ranges from 1.00 to 0.00, the lower the number the better the material is at stopping heat transfer.

SHGC (Solar Heat Gain Coefficient) is the relative amount of solar gain through a fenestration product (window or door). SHGC ranges from 1.00 to 0.00, the lower the number the better the product is at blocking solar gain from entering the home.

Homeowners are required to maintain records that the windows and/or doors meet the qualification requirements. These records are to include purchase receipts and the Manufacturer Certification Statement. A Manufacturer Certification is a signed statement from the manufacturer certifying that the product or component qualifies for the tax credit. In this context, "component" refers to a building component, not a component of the product. Taxpayers must keep a copy of the certification statement for their records, but do not have to submit a copy with their tax return.
